CONGREGATION-BASED SEMINARY EDUCATION

The new program offers students the opportunity to stay closer to home and the congregations they serve. Coursework is coupled with true congregational ministry. Our students go beyond simply understanding the scripture; they learn to interpret it for the church.

PASTORAL MENTORS AND COVENANT GROUPS

Every student is assigned a pastor as a mentor. Students also participate in a covenant group made up of fellow students, a professor and a pastor—a support group to help students with their congregational experiences.

PASTORS AND PROFESSORS AS PARTNERS

Our students learn from the experiences of seasoned clergy. In addition to serving as adjunct faculty, pastors are invited to be class discussion partners to strengthen the application of coursework in the congregation.

FLEXIBLE ONLINE AND INTENSIVE ON-SITE COURSES

This new model of education emphasizes both flexibility of location and the time commitment for each course. Up to two-thirds of classes will be available online. The remaining classes will be short, intensive courses at the seminary or an off-site location, not requiring students to move.

NEW OPPORTUNITIES FOR NEW VOICES

The new model offers flexibility to a variety of students, from those seeking a degree to lay leaders who want to enhance their service to the church by furthering their education. It also reaches more students who represent the textured, diverse face of today's church and the depth of voices needed to shape the church of tomorrow.

FAITHFUL, ACCREDITED THEOLOGICAL EDUCATION

Lexington Theological Seminary is accredited by the Association of Theological Schools. Founded in 1865, LTS is the oldest seminary of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), now embracing the newest form of shaping church leaders.
